Parent Study Guide – Bonus Verse 2011-12 THE PATH OF FREEDOM – Proverbs 3:5-6

Passage: Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;

in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.

-- Proverbs 3:5-6 (NIV84)

Theme: THE PATH OF FREEDOM – True and lasting freedom only comes by trusting God.

Metaphor: LIFE IS LIKE A PATH -- It can be straight, direct and even; or crooked, wandering and hard.

Message: GOD WILL DIRECT OUR PATHS -- if we trust and acknowledge Him completely.

Action: TRUST GOD IN EVERYTHING – with all of your year and all of your ways.

Discussion Questions: Answers are Underlined

- 1. Why is trust so important? Is it possible to live without trust? We were designed to be dependent upon others and ultimately upon God. We cannot live without trust (Ps. 22:9-10 and Ps. 71:5-6).
- 2. How do we trust in the Lord? Should we always trust Him? We trust God by obeying Him (Deut.7:9; Ps. 78:7).
- 3. Do we have to trust people? Should we always trust them? <u>Life constantly forces us to evaluate the trustworthiness of others</u>. But sometimes people let us down and betray our <u>trust</u>. (Ps. 41:9 and Ps. 118:8-9).
- 4. How is trusting people different from trusting in the Lord? <u>God clearly warns us that trusting in man will lead to disaster, but blessing will come to us by trusting in Him. God alone is completely trustworthy (Jer. 17:5-8).</u>
- 5. What does it mean to trust God with *all* your heart? <u>To obey and follow Him</u> <u>"wholeheartedly" (Josh. 14:7-9).</u>
- 6. Why does God tell us not to *lean* on our own understanding? <u>Our own understanding at</u> <u>first seems right but soon will mislead us and deceive us (Prov. 12:15 & 21:2).</u>
- 7. Is our understanding important when we exercise trust? We are always to seek wise counsel and advice (Prov. 1:5 and 19:20), and God will make us know wisdom in our own heart (Ps. 51:6).
- 8. What does it mean to *acknowledge* something or someone? <u>The Old Testament view of knowledge</u> is both relational and experiential. To acknowledge God meant to know Him personally and to obey Him (Hos. 6:6)

- 9. How do we acknowledge God in *all* our ways? <u>By studying & meditating on His Word & obeying Him (Ps.1:1-3).</u>
- 10. What is the difference between a straight path and a crooked path (Prov. 11:5 and Isaiah 59:8)? The way of the righteous is ultimately smoother and easier, but the way of the wicked is crooked, devious and hard.
- 11. Who has a tendency to wander off the path (Isaiah 53:6)? All of us, like sheep, go astray. It's in our nature.
- 12. What is the relationship between following God's path and a heart that is free (Psalm 119:32 & 45)? God sets us free from the bondage of sin, the hard road of rebellion, and the delusion of self-reliance.
- 13. What did John, Paul and Peter say about freedom (John 8:32; Rom. 8:2; 1Pet. 2:16)? <u>The truth will set us free</u>; Christ sets us free from the law of sin and death; and we are to live as <u>"free men" rather than as prisoners.</u>
- 14. What did James say about God's law, freedom and blessing (James 1:25)? <u>God's Word is the</u> <u>perfect law that gives freedom, "the law of liberty."</u>

Biblical & Theological Background:

- 1. We are designed by God to trust and depend on Him (Psalm 22:9-10 and 71:5-6).
- 2. We are commanded to walk by faith rather than by sight (2 Cor. 5:7).
- 3. God is the only completely trustworthy being in the universe because of His unchanging character (James 1:17), eternal power and divine nature (Rom. 1:20).
- 4. Freedom from sin comes by renewing the mind & transforming the heart (Rom. 12:1-2; Eph. 4:23-24).
