Our desire is that all of our students will leave high school with a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as their Savior, built on a foundation of truth that is tested and resilient against the winds of culture. Therefore, our curriculum is designed to be academically challenging and biblically rich, and our teachers are spiritually mature and actively engaged in students' lives. Our school culture is designed to inspire students to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ. We want them to experience authentic community as those who are in relationship with Christ, living out their faith in contrast to the empty offerings of the world. We want our students to understand the truth that Jesus Christ permeates all that we do, transforming even our approach to scholarship.

Many institutions stress the importance of educating students to have good character by exposing students to inspiring speakers or requiring community service outside the hours of school. Few institutions create a culture where living your faith in service to others is central to the curriculum, beginning at the youngest grades and lasting throughout high school. Immanuel Christian High School has always acknowledged the importance of character strengthened through service—not as an end but rather as a reflection of a growing and mature relationship with Jesus Christ.

There is much that we can accomplish at Immanuel Christian High School, through outstanding academics, athletics and the arts; but it is the biblical foundations for life that sets us apart. This life preparation for high school students is not readily found in other schools and it is the central reason why Immanuel Christian High School exists.

1 LITERACY

In today's world, reading and writing take place in multiple media formats with an expanding array of audiences. Our students must develop the skills to communicate clearly and effectively in all formats while learning to interpret text and media messages with wisdom and discernment. (Hebrews 5:14)

2 GRIT

Grit is determination, strength of character, and resolve which enables students to stay focused on achieving long-term goals. When students have grit, they stay committed to a task in the face of adversity. (II Peter 1:5-8)

3 SOCIAL INTELLIGENCE

Social intelligence matters because relationships matter. God designed humans to live in relationship with Him and with others. Through godly mentors and guided experiential learning, students develop the habits of discernment and grace that will allow them to navigate complex social and emotional situations with Christlike character. (Galatians 5:22-23)

4 GRATITUDE

Gratitude is the essential life skill of valuing and appreciating the people, opportunities, and blessings in life. It is not easily accomplished because it does not come naturally. Rather, our students must practice the habit of thankfulness. (Colossians 2:7)

5 OPTIMISM

Optimism is essential because it is the ability to view failure not as a reflection of personal worth or ability, but a learning experience. Students at Immanuel Christian High School are not defined by success or failure, but through their identity as believers in Christ. They will develop the fortitude to deal with the hardships of life and press on because of the hope that is in their Savior.

(Lamentations 3:21-23)

6 SELF-RESTRAINT

God calls us to moderation and self-restraint as manifestations of His grace. Self-restraint is more than just saying no to the bad; it also includes postponing the good, knowing that God has something better. Learning to surrender the desire for what is unnecessary or excessive, and choosing God's timely provision is a sign of Christian maturity. (Titus 2:11-13)

7 ZEAL

Immanuel students will live as participants rather than spectators, engaged in constructive relationships, intellectual curiosity, problem solving, and a passion for service. They will discover how to invest their personal talents and skills in real life opportunities for passionate and purposeful living. (Romans 12:11)

8 CITIZENSHIP

As those who will one day be the decision-makers for our country, students will learn the biblical heritage of our nation and develop the civic responsibility that is critical if they are to become the godly Leaders of America's future. (Titus 2:7-8)

9 EMPATHY

Empathy and compassion require students to imagine themselves in the place of those who suffer and to invest themselves on behalf of those whose lives are difficult. Empathy characterized the attitude and actions of the Good Samaritan who put the needs of another above his own.

(Romans 12:15)

We firmly believe that through interscholastic athletics a student's character will be revealed, which allows the opportunity for coaches to partner with parents in building a Christ-like character and inspiring a purposeful life. Student-Athletes are required to meet certain standards in order to maintain a courteous, but powerful character. Students who participate in a sport, learn about positive attitude and teamwork. Individuals experience winning, losing, working with others, handling themselves when others push them to their limits, and many more skills. They are able to answer questions like: How does one react after losing? Do they end up showing poor sportsmanship and blaming others for the loss or do they accept the fact that the other team was more prepared? When a team wins, do individuals brag about the score and insult their opponents or do they celebrate their success while being respectful?




