- **Required:** *Next Spring an Oriole* by Gloria Whelan
- **Must read one of the following:** Any book by Beverly Cleary

Rising 4th Graders

- **Required:** *A Lion to Guard Us* by Clyde Robert Bulla
- **Must read one of the following** by Kate DiCamillo:
