GODLINESS

The Bible shows us who God is, his story of redemption, why we should trust in him, and how to live in light of his Word. The Bible curriculum at Immanuel Christian School introduces children to these concepts and systematically adds to their understanding of God and his Word as they grow. As they mature, our curriculum guides them in thinking critically about the world around them, applying the truth of scripture to cultural trends and ideas, and learning how to defend their faith.

BIBLE CURRICULUM

K SIMPLE OVERVIEWS

OT: A high-level overview from Genesis to Malachi.

NT: The birth of Jesus through his death, burial, and resurrection.

1 OT FOUNDATIONS

A more detailed OT survey with a concentration on the promises made to Abraham that bless all mankind, as well as a study on breaking the sin cycle found in Judges.

2 NT FOUNDATIONS

Brief OT review and expanded NT study of the birth, public ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus, with an emphasis on the gospel. Introduction to the structure of the Bible and verse references.

3 STUDY SKILLS

In-depth study of the OT Books of the Law, from creation through the wilderness wanderings, including the covenants with Abraham, Moses, and the Israelites.

4 IN-DEPTH STUDY SKILLS

A brief overview of the Books of the Law with emphasis on the Messianic promises. In-depth study of Joshua, Judges, Ruth, and 1 & 2 Samuel, including OT worship and the Tabernacle.

5 THE AUTHORITY OF GOD

Expanded OT study of the united and divided kingdom, exile, and return, focusing on the wait for Jesus as King.

6 THE IDENTITY OF JESUS

In-depth study of the Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark, and Luke - and the NT letters Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Titus, and James.

7 OBEDIENCE TO JESUS

A study of the Gospel of John, and of the NT letters 1 and 2 Thessalonians, 1 and 2 Peter, 1, 2, and 3 John, Philemon, and Revelation.

8 OUR IDENTITY IN JESUS

A study of Acts, and the NT letters of Romans, Hebrews, 1 and 2 Corinthians, Colossians, 1 and 2 Timothy, and Jude.

HS BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW & APOLOGETICS

HS students are being prepared for adulthood, which entails first and foremost taking ownership of their faith. To help them on this journey, students undergo four years of training in **theology, western culture, worldviews, and apologetics**, while wrestling with current cultural trends and what it means to be a Christian in a post-modern age. Students also study a book of the Bible every year. The goal of this training is for them to love and submit their lives to the Lord Jesus Christ, and to be equipped and prepared to fulfill the Great Commission.
